

Substance Abuse in Patients with Schizophrenic and/or Bipolar Disorder



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BACKGROUND AND IMPORTANCE




Substance abuse is a common **comorbidity** in patients with severe psychiatric disorders such as schizophrenia and bipolar disorder. The interaction between these conditions and substance use **complicates diagnosis and treatment**, as it can worsen symptoms and affect management.

AIM AND OBJECTIVES



- To study the prevalence of substance abuse in patients diagnosed with schizophrenia or bipolar disorder in a psychiatric unit.
- To examine the differences in substance use by sex, diagnosis, and type of substance consumed, alongside the presence of psychotic episodes before diagnosis.

MATERIAL AND METHODS



- 1 year retrospective observational study
- 450-bed university hospital




Patients admitted to the psychiatric unit (acute and subacute) diagnosed with schizophrenia or bipolar disorder, and/or documented substance abuse

Variables collected: sex, birthdate, type of diagnosis, diagnosis date, substance use (alcohol, opioids, cannabis, cocaine, amphetamines, hallucinogens, others), age of substance use onset, and history of psychotic episodes before diagnosis.



Descriptive statistical analysis was conducted using frequencies for categorical variables and measures of central tendency and dispersion for quantitative variables.

RESULTS



Mean age: 47±14 years

63,8% men; 36,2% women



149 (60,6%)

patients diagnosed with a psychiatric condition (schizophrenia/bipolar disorder)



- Mean age at the diagnose: 34±13 years
- 63,1% schizophrenia; 36,9% bipolar disorder

103 (69,1%)

cases of **substance abuse** in patients diagnosed with schizophrenia/bipolar disorder




- Mean age at the start of abuse: 17±4 years
- 66% men; 34% women


Diagnose-specific prevalence

prevalence	Schizophrenia	Bipolar disorder
Substance abuse	67%	72,7%
Polysubstance use (Use of ≥2 substances)	72,7%	67,5%
Psychotic episodes prior to diagnose	61,9%	50%

CONCLUSION AND RELEVANCE



There is a high prevalence of substance abuse in patients with schizophrenia and bipolar disorder, particularly among men and schizophrenia patients. Polysubstance use and prior psychotic episodes were more common in schizophrenia patients.

It is important to <u>understand the dynamics of substance abuse</u> in schizophrenic and bipolar patients for a comprehensive approach to managing their conditions.



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
