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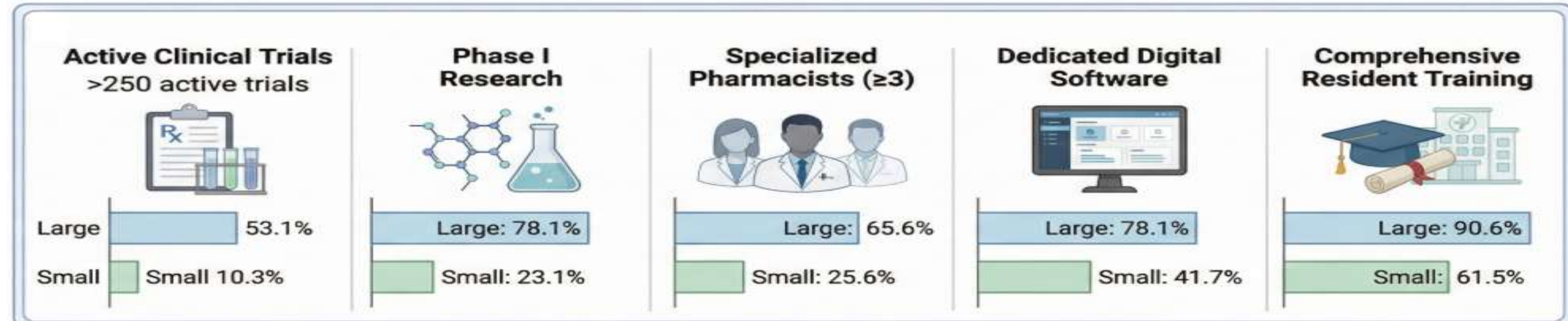
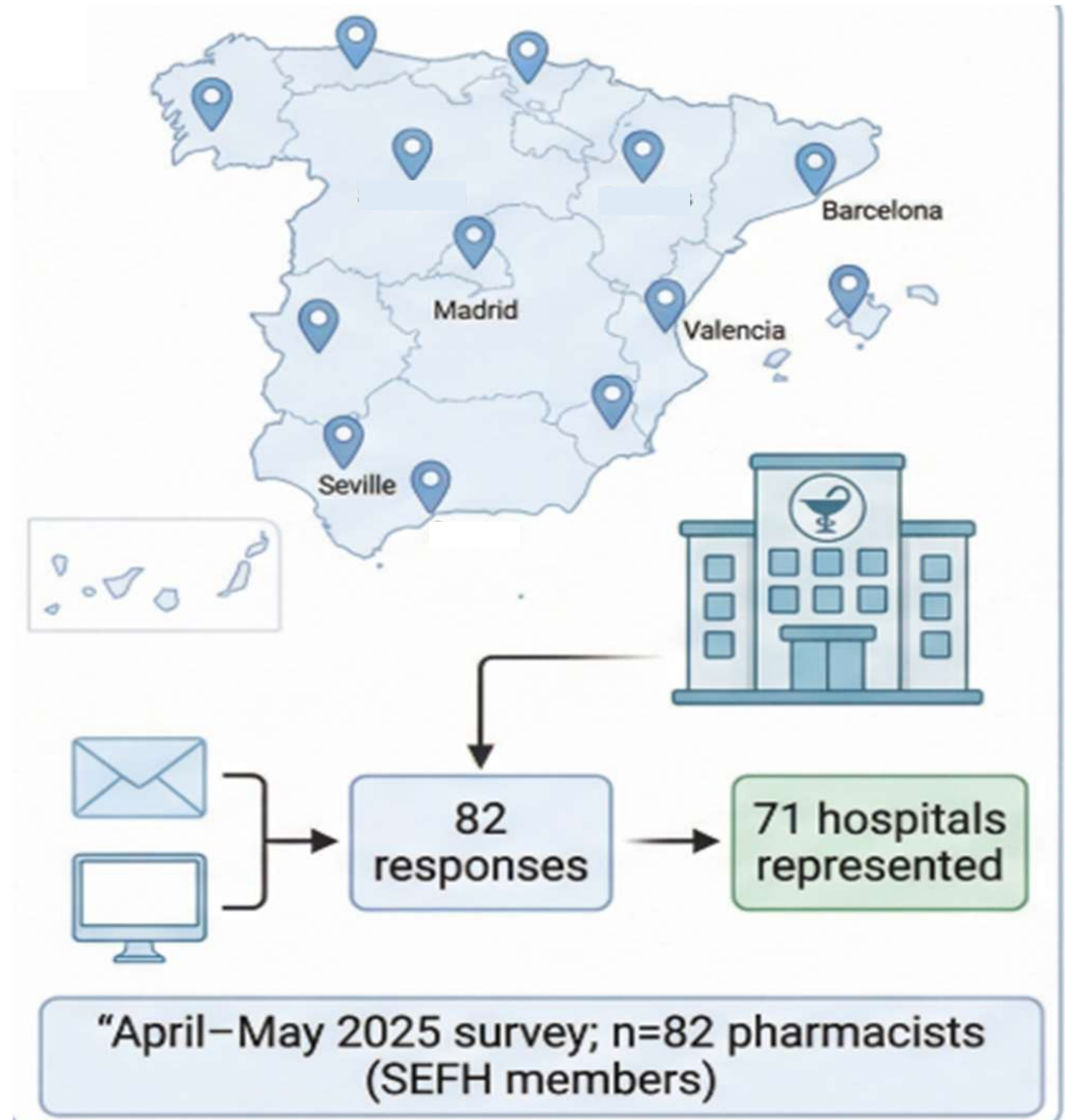
BACKGROUND

There is no established staffing standard in Clinical Trial Units within Spanish Hospital Pharmacy Services in relation to the number and complexity of clinical trials.

AIM

To analyze the current situation of clinical trial units within Spanish Hospital Pharmacy Services and the training provided to pharmacy residents

RESULTS: all results were statistically significant.



CONCLUSION

Being competitive in clinical research requires sufficient specialized staff, appropriate software, and adequate investment in Pharmacy Services. Hospitals with greater resources achieve better research output, highlighting the importance of proper infrastructure.
