

NAPPROPRIATE PRESCRIBING FOR ELDERLY PEOPLE : IS THE HOSPITAL THE INITIATOR?

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BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

Adverse drug reactions for older people = Cause of hospitalization of 10 to 20% of people aged of 60 years or over

Potentially inappropriate drugs (PID) : Medications with an unfavorable benefit/risk ratio or a questionable efficacy while other and safer therapeutic alternatives are available



Are PID prescribed to our patients? Who did the first prescription occurring for this treatment : our hospital doctors or family doctors?



MATERIALS AND METHODS

A list of PID, which contains 34 criteria, specially adapted to the French medical practice, was used as a reference (1). Only 28 concern drugs used in our hospital. We analyzed the prescriptions of patients, who were 75 years old or over, hospitalized one precise day chosen arbitrarily, in medical, chirurgical and obstetrical care units.

CONCLUSIONS

Studies showed that PID are responsible for 6% of adverse events due to medications. These results were diffused to care units concerned to improve the prescription's quality for elderly people. Collaborating with geriatrics specialists, we will elaborate a tool able to aware doctors about psychotropic drugs' prescriptions.
