MERGING THE MEDICATION RECONCILIATION AND THE HOSPITALIZATION REPORT TO FORM THE LIAISON LETTER IN A DEPARTMENT OF OTOLARYNGOLOGY






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BACKGROUND AND IMPORTANCE

- Since January 1, 2017, the liaison letter (LL) has been mandatory (Decree No. 2016-995, 2016). Our hospital implemented it in May 2020 for digestive surgery and in December 2020 for orthopaedic surgery.
- The objective is to optimize patient care by allowing better coordination between health professionals. We have merged the hospital report (HR) and the medication report (MR) to form a single common document LL in the department of otolaryngology.



OBJECTIVES

- **Assess** changes in practice
- **Evaluate** satisfaction among hospital staff

MATERIAL AND METHODS



- \bigcirc A prospective observational study was conducted from March 1 to April 1, 2021. The information is collected in a table with two parts: patient identity and documents created.
- A survey including 8 questions was distributed to collect the knowledge, the use, and the satisfaction of the Hospital staff (HS): nurses, surgeons, anaesthetists and polyvalent doctors.

RESULTS

PROSPECTIVE OBSERVATIONAL STUDY: conducted from March 1 to April 1, 2021.

The main reasons for hospitalization are: parotidectomy, laryngectomy and thyroidectomy



The median age was 61.5 years [17;89]



The average length of stay was 4.77 days [1;16].




