

Using the PPMI?


? PPMI is linked to USA-Situation

Why have a Summit on Hospital Pharmacy?

The overall purposes and objectives of the proposed European Summit on Hospital Pharmacy can be summarised as:

- To provide clarity about the future path of development for hospital pharmacy services that the profession AND ITS STAKEHOLDERS want to see achieved
- To provide an achievable and practical framework for raising standards of practice that all countries in Europe can make use of
- To help hospital pharmacy in Europe meet known and unknown challenges, and be the best it can be, in the patient interest
- In doing this, to build on existing work including the FIP Basel Statements (2008) and Pharmine (2011)

REQUIREMENTS FOR SUCCESS: OUTCOMES OF THE SUMMIT ARE CLEAR, PRACTICAL, AND USEABLE; AND ARE SUPPORTED AND ENDORSED BY THE PATIENT COMMUNITY WITH THEIR FULL INPUT SAUGHT AND SECURED

STAGE 3

Implementing the Summit outcomes (2014 and beyond)

Including raising awareness of the Summit outcomes and how they can be achieved.

Principal activities of WG 1 to achieve its task

- Develop a criteria for membership and participation in the stakeholder panel that is transparent, reasonable and stands up to external scrutiny
- Work with stakeholders to adequately prepare their knowledge and interest in hospital pharmacy and help stakeholders to appreciate the relevance of hospital pharmacy activity to the stakeholder community they represent
- Develop the voting mechanisms, agenda and operating procedures of the Summit itself
- Provide linkage between the work of the other Working Groups.
- Perform the communication, marketing and awareness raising activity of the overall Summit (before, during and after)



WG 1: Criteria for Stakeholders

- The organisation must be European-wide in its scope
- The organisation's remit must be firmly within the health sector linked to hospital pharmacy practice
- The organisation must be sufficiently independent of industry or commercial interest to the satisfaction of the Summit Steering Group
- The organisation must be willing and able to invest a requisite amount of time and energy to participation in the Summit, including time spent in preparation for the event




WG 1: Criteria for Delegates

- Broad knowledge of the situation of Hospital Pharmacy in their country
- Reporting to and representing the board of the national association
- Good english language skills
- Time and commitment to actively participate in the summit



Vote

- Every member of EAHP 1 vote = 50%
- Every patient group 1 vote up to 25%
- Other health professionals groups 1 vote up to 25%
- 85% of total vote necessary for agreement
- Less than 50% of total vote rejection
- 51-74% of total or gap between HP and the other groups more than 25% amendment after discussion
