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## About the World Antibiotic Awareness Week European Antibiotic Awareness Day

The **World Antibiotic Awareness Week** (WAAW) of the World Health Organisation aims at increasing awareness of global antibiotic resistance and encouraging best practices among the general public, healthcare professionals and policy makers to avoid the further emergence and spread of antibiotic resistance.

The European Antibiotic Awareness Day (EAAD) is an annual European public health initiative that takes place during the WAAW on 18 November to raise awareness about the threat of antibiotic resistance and the importance of prudent antibiotic use. It was created by the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control.

We invite you all to actively get involved in the fight against resistance to antibiotics!

This toolkit has been designed to provide you with the essential information you need to take part in the campaign. We hope that it will help inspire and assist you to develop your own awareness activities and actions.

# World Antibiotic Awareness Week / European Antibiotic Awareness Day 2018

The emergence of antibiotic resistance is recognised as a major public health concern. According to the European Commission<sup>1</sup>, 25,000 patients die annually in the EU alone as a result of infections caused by resistant bacteria, while globally the number could be as high as 700,000.

In the last decades we have witnessed an increase in the ability of a microorganism to mutate and stop an antimicrobial from working against it. As a consequence, only a limited number of antibiotics is available to treat infections caused by resistant bacteria. Antimicrobial resistance has a direct negative outcome not only for the patients (persistence and spread of infections), but also the healthcare budget due to increased treatment costs. Consequently, significant concerted actions need to be undertaken in order to ensure that prevention protocols and standards are Implemented and used.

This year's EAAD theme is "keep antibiotics working". The theme explores the role of all healthcare workers in reducing antibiotic resistance in hospitals and other healthcare settings through infection prevention and control measures. During WAAW and on EAAD, EAHP encourages hospital pharmacists to actively engage. Hospital pharmacists should promote their contribution to multidisciplinary care teams. Moreover, they should promote their role in reviewing antibiotic duration, advising on the

cessation of inappropriate antibiotic treatments, and educating other healthcare professionals on the restricted use of certain antibiotics.

### How to get involved?

Taking part in World Antibiotic Awareness Week/ European Antibiotic Awareness Day is an excellent occasion for hospital pharmacists, health professionals, advocates, patients, governments and the general public not only to discuss, but also to take concrete steps towards improving preventive efforts against infections and changing how we produce, market, prescribe and use antibiotics.

## Key messages

## • Improve stewardship of antimicrobials locally via your hospital pharmacist

National governments and health system managers need to take proactive steps in order to develop and benefit from the key resource that is within their midst in terms of combating antimicrobial resistance: the hospital pharmacist. The reason is evident: his/her specialised background and practical knowledge in the area of appropriate antibiotic use. The national level AMR crisis strategic response must include the hospital pharmacist and the use of antibiotic stewardship teams.

#### Highlight the need for new incentives to develop antibiotics

An urgent review of the current research and development environment for new antibiotics, and development of fresh proposals for pan-European action on the matter is needed. National governments should be encouraged to increase investment to support the development of innovative proposals and the encouragement of practice based research projects to investigate new fields of infectious disease control such as immunotherapy.

#### • Set an example by using prophylactic measures like vaccination and hygiene

The efforts of prophylaxis like vaccination and hygiene are additional supportive, important and need to be further enhanced. Ensure in your own work environment that hand hygiene as the single most important prophylactic measure is further prompted.
